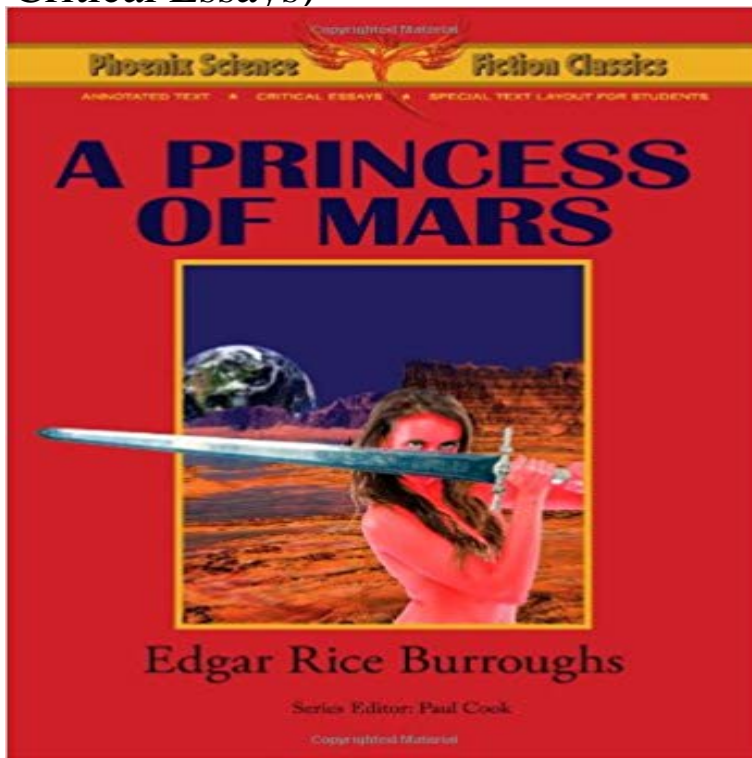


A Princess of Mars - Phoenix Science Fiction Classics (with Notes and Critical Essays)
