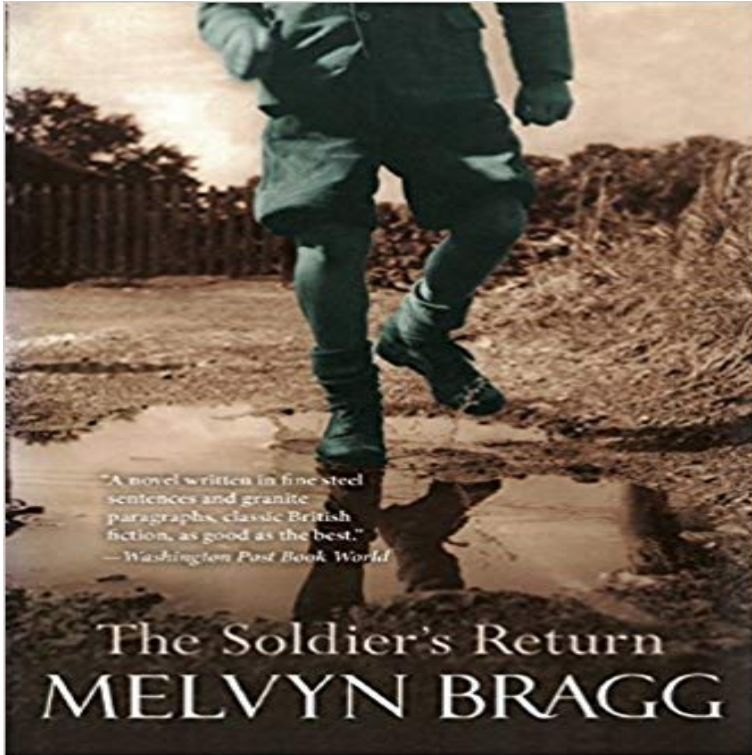


The Soldiers Return
