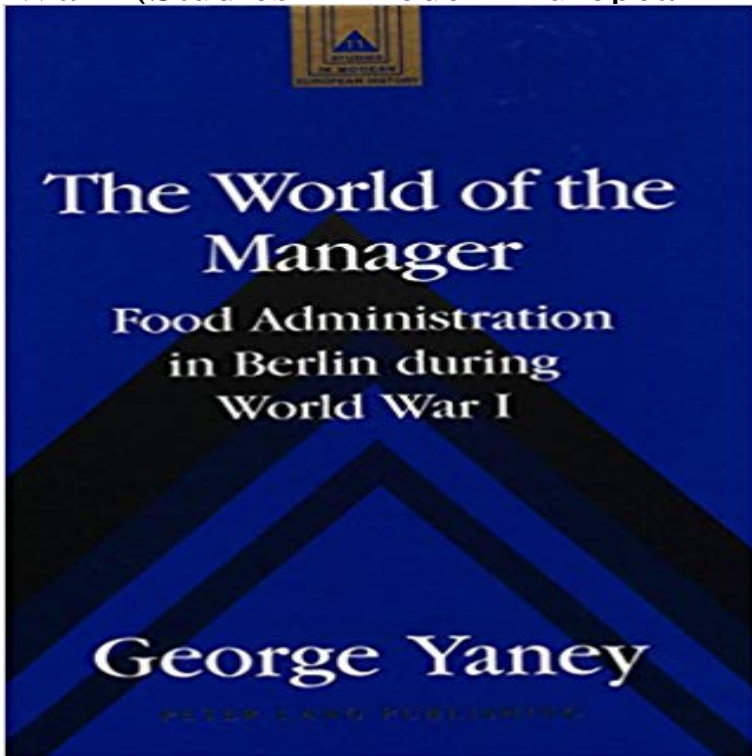


# The World of the Manager: Food Administration in Berlin during World War I (Studies in Modern European History)
