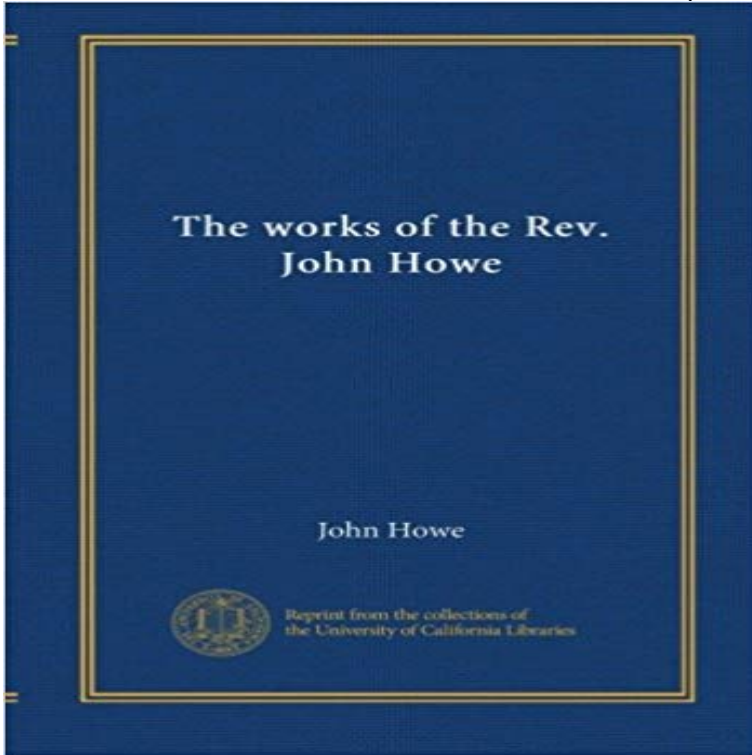


The works of the Rev. John Howe (v. 2)
