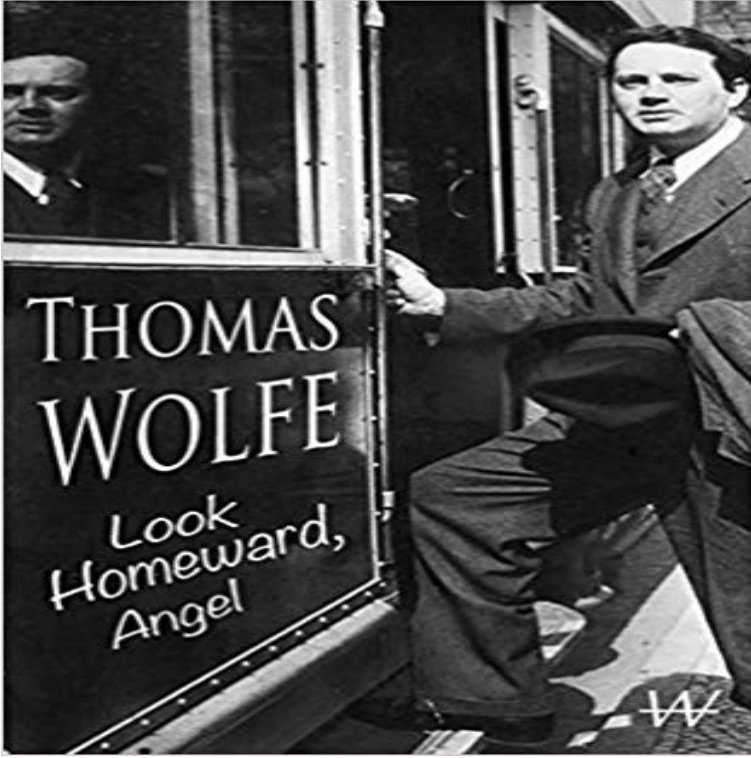


Look Homeward, Angel
