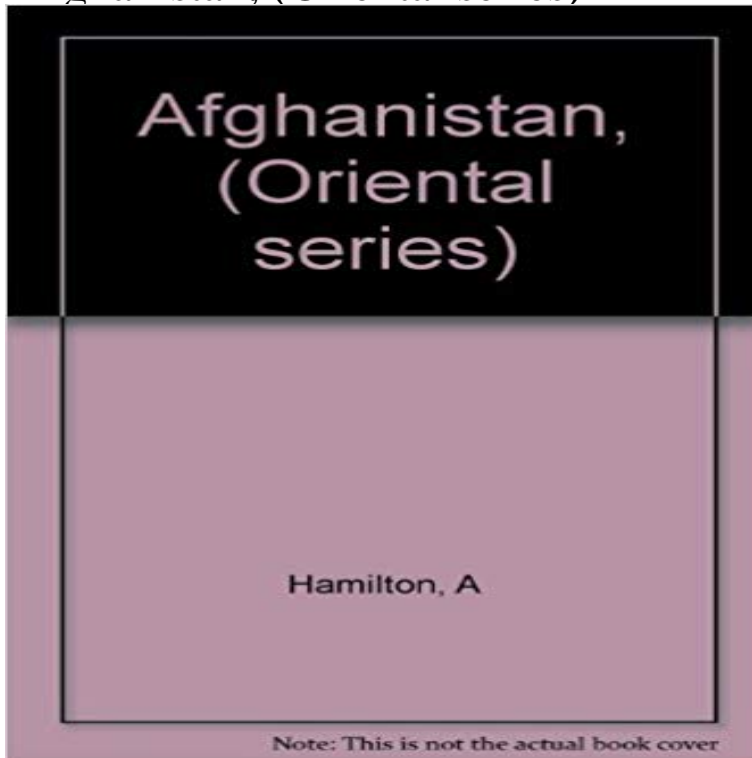


Afghanistan, (Oriental series)
