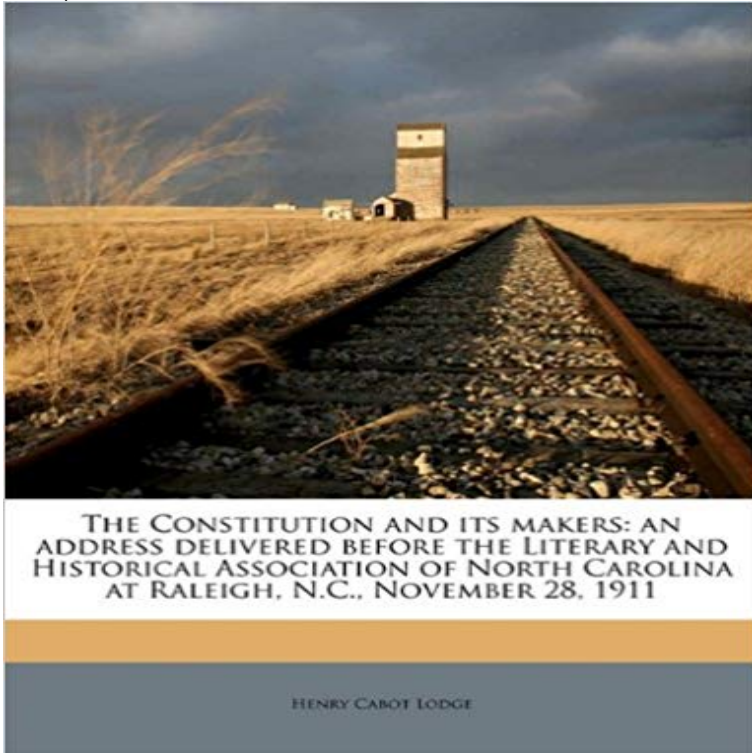


# The Constitution and its makers: an address delivered before the Literary and Historical Association of North Carolina at Raleigh, N.C., November 28, 1911
