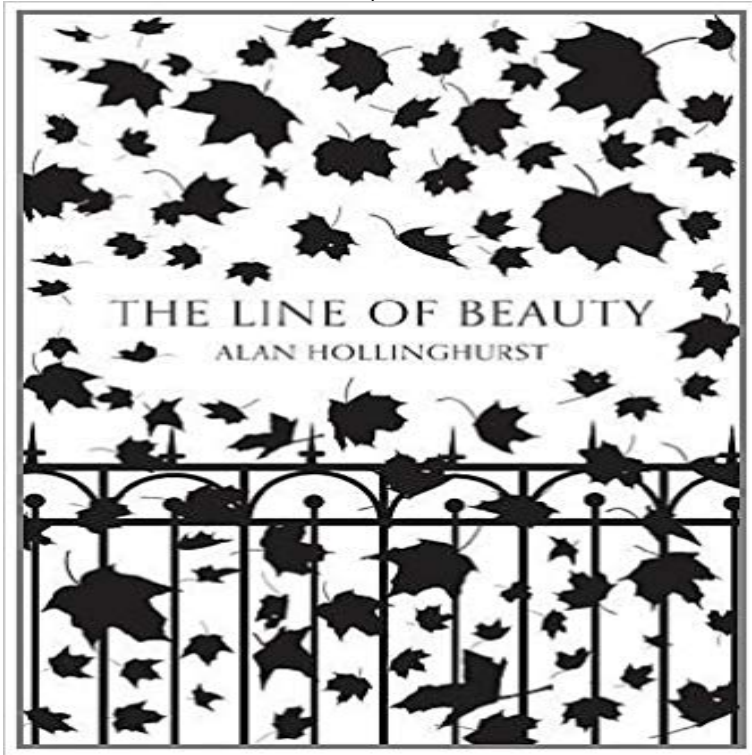


The Line of Beauty
