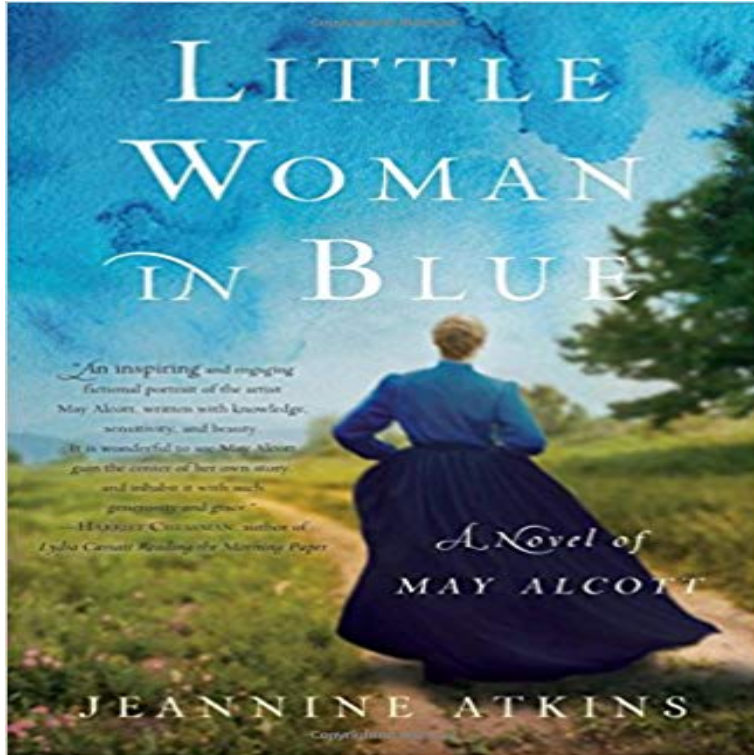


## Little Woman in Blue: A Novel of May Alcott
