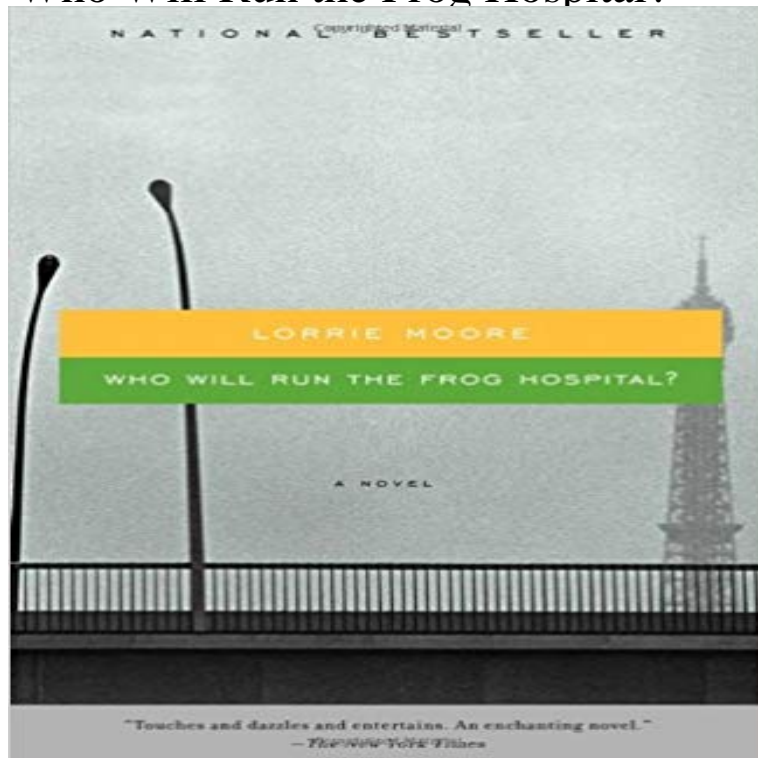


Who Will Run the Frog Hospital?
